## Lawrence Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competition Guide 2023 – 2024

## <u>Competition Date</u>: October 29, 2023, 1:00 p.m., Memorial Chapel <u>Nominations due</u>: October 26, 2023, by 12:00 noon to Julia Jackson, Conservatory Office Performance Date with the LSO: *TBD*

This competition is offered annually by the LSO, and is open to any student enrolled in applied music study at Lawrence University who has been nominated in writing by their studio teacher. The top one or two winners are to perform in an LSO concert; *Date TBD*. A maximum of two winners may be selected and judges also reserve the right to pick no winner.

- Each applied department (strings, keyboard, voice, winds, brass/percussion) will organize its own individual **preliminary competition/hearing** to determine which maximum three students will represent their department in the final LSO Concerto Competition. The final competition will include a maximum of 15 participants representing the 5 applied departments.
- One movement from a concerto or an equivalently substantial work with orchestra is admissible. You may audition with complete concertos if the total length does not exceed 25 minutes. Memorization is required in appropriate situations where that would be the normal expectation. The department chair and studio teachers are responsible for ensuring availability of the work. Additionally, the panel/director reserves the right to modify the winners' selection for the performance with the orchestra.
- **Competition audition slots** will be a maximum of 15 minutes in length (no exceptions). The student participant will organize their own audition excerpts that best represent the overall performance within the 15-minute time limit. The audition must include excerpts from every section in the movement or from each movement where applicable. The faculty judges will not interrupt a student's predetermined 15-minute audition presentation. All cadenzas must be performed.
- Competitors must provide their **own accompanist** and must submit **their own copy of the full score for the judges.**
- Competitors are not disqualified from competing in future LSO Concerto Competitions, however winners may not compete again in the future.
- The judging panel will consist of no fewer than 3 and no more than 8 judges and made up from the Dean of the Conservatory and/or the Associate Dean of the Conservatory, the Director of Orchestral Studies, and one member of each of the 5 applied departments. It is the responsibility of the department chairs to ensure a member of his or her department is present on the judging panel. A department may forfeit its representative if there is no student competing from the department.
